## HOME OF THE WOLVERINES

### University of Pittsburgh Bradford

As a regional campus of the University of Pittsburgh, Pitt-Bradford graduates earn the world-renowned Pitt Degree. To help students finance their education, many types of financial aid are provided. Nearly all students who apply for aid receive some kind of assistance. During the 2017-18 academic year, the average financial aid award was \$19,903 for PA residents. Over a four year period, these awards total \$79,612 for a large number of in-state students—aid that significantly lessens the financial burden for some families. It is important to note that not all of our financial aid is need based. We offer generous scholarships that are based on your student's high school academic performance. To qualify, students need only a cumulative GPA of 2.5 or greater and a minimum SAT score of 1010 or an ACT score of 20. Scholarships range from \$1,000 to \$5,500 and are renewable for up to four years as long as the student maintains eligibility requirements. Besides tuition, you may not know that our basic room and board rates are also among the top five most affordable rates for four-year public colleges. ## COLLEGE SPECIFIC SCHOLARSHIPS

### Pitt Greensburg Campus



- Pitt-Greensburg is holding a scholarship competition for one of three **FULL TUITION SCHOLARSHIPS\***. Eligible students must have a high school cumulative GPA of 3.8 or higher, an ACT score of 26 or higher or a total SAT score (EBRW+Math) of 1250 or higher, and be a US citizen or permanent resident. First you must apply to Pitt-Greensburg and be admitted by January 15, 2019. Then you must fill out the scholarship application. **Applications for the scholarship must be postmarked no later than January 22, 2019** and can be found at <http://greensburg.pitt.edu/fulltuitionscholarship>. This scholarship can be renewed for up to 4 years of tuition, with adequate academic progress and GPA while at Pitt-Greensburg.

### Duquesne University

- **Bayer Scholars Program**—This **FULL TUITION SCHOLARSHIP** program accepts academically talented and motivated freshman who are majoring in the Bayer School of Biological Sciences, Chemistry, Biological Chemistry, Physics, Environmental Science, and Forensic Science and Law. The program admits six students each year and is open to women and minority students. *It features four year full tuition scholarship support, personalized course work, mentoring by Duquesne science faculty and Bayer professionals, and paid summer internships.* Applicants must be of African American, Hispanic/Latino, American Indian, or female, a US Citizen or a permanent resident, and entering the Bayer School of Natural and Environmental Sciences as a freshman. Admission to this program is competitive.
