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Hello Families!

On Monday, Tuesday, and Wednesday of next week, all scholars in grades K-12 in the Woodland Hills School District will take the NWEA MAP Assessment. This assessment will be our first chance to see how virtual instruction is impacting our scholars. More importantly, this assessment will give all scholars the opportunity to show what they know. **It is very important that you let your child take this assessment without assistance!** The test is adaptive, which means that each scholar is expected to get 50% correct and 50% incorrect. Please review the information below to ensure that next week will be a success! We appreciate your partnership in completing this testing as it allows us to gain valuable information to inform our instruction in the following months.

In preparation for our remote NWEA testing next week please do the following:




 Check that your child's device is ready for testing by visiting <https://check.nwea.org/>. Please let your child's teacher know if it shows any problems.

Next Week:


-  On Monday morning, your child will report to their first period class as usual. Their teacher will open the testing session and send the login information for the session at this website: <https://test.mapnwea.org/#/nopopup>.
-  They will continue this process on Tuesday and Wednesday morning as well.
-  When their test session ends, they will complete the day on their normal schedule.

Then, your child will enter the session name and password given to them by their teacher to login. Their teacher will then confirm the test for your child to begin. The teacher will be able to see their progress as they work.

Helpful Testing Information

 For the math test students may use scratch paper to solve their problems.

 Any test questions that are allowed to be read will be read to your child, or can be read to them by clicking the read-aloud button on the screen.

 The test is responsive to correct and incorrect answers. There will be questions that your child will not know and that is okay!


 If your child gets stuck, encourage them to take their best guess and continue on. It's okay to not know!

 Teachers will have a google meet or Zoom link open if you experience any trouble.

Remember that these assessments are **not evaluative, and will NOT affect your child's grade**. They are merely an opportunity for us to collect data on what your child knows and where we can continue to help them grow. Teachers will use this information as they plan rigorous and effective instruction for next semester.
